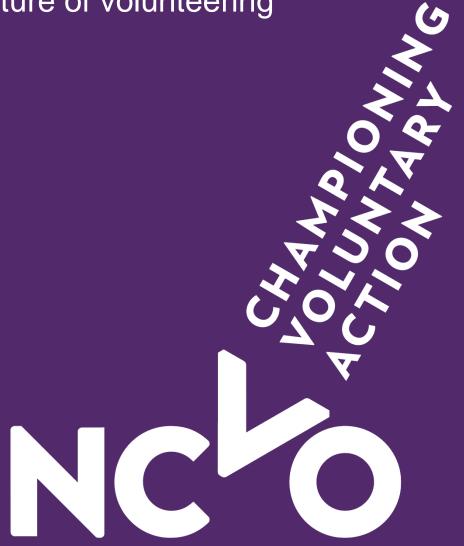

1. AWARENESS OF VOLUNTEERING IS HIGH









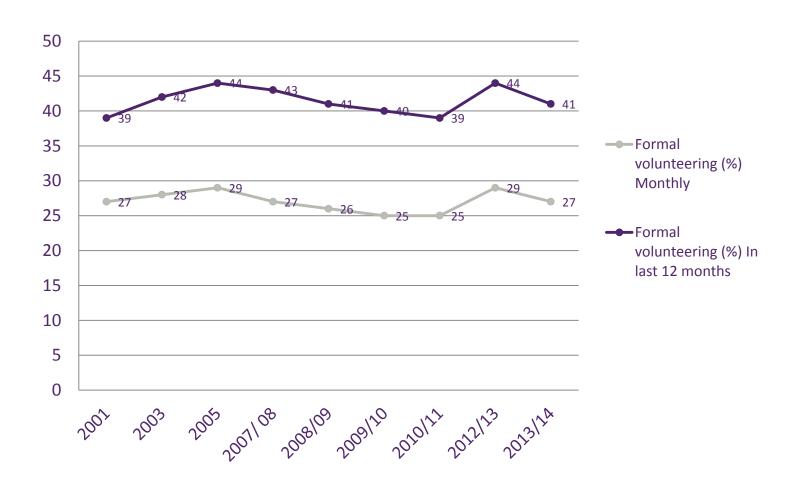


2. RECOGNITION OF THE BROADER VALUE OF VOLUNTEERING IS INCREASING

- The connection between volunteering and well-being is becoming understood
- Economic valuations of volunteering are getting more nuanced and holistic
- But we also need to recognise the limitations of these calculations

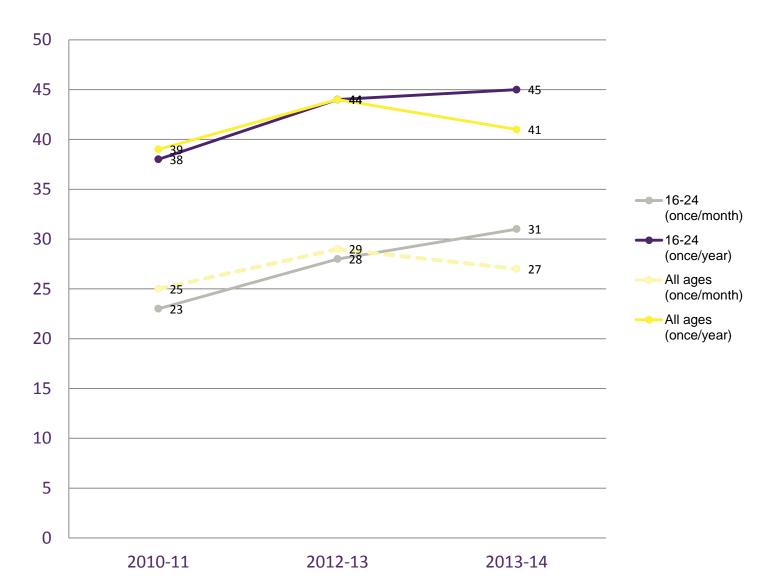

5. THE SUPPORT AND MANAGEMENT OF VOLUNTEERS HAS IMPROVED

- Growing recognition of the value of volunteer management and growth as a profession
- New systems introduced into volunteering to enhance the experience and impact
- Volunteers appear to be more satisfied with their management
 - 1997: 71% volunteers said they felt their volunteering could be 'much better organised'
 - 2007: 31%
- But one size does not fit all



6. THE REFORM OF PUBLIC SERVICES IS PRESENTING NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR VOLUNTEERS

- Huge opportunities for services that are coproduced or volunteer-led
- Builds on long and effective history
- Benefits include: more accountable services; better connection to community; bringing in new skills; allowing services to do more
- Requires carefully-designed roles and genuine understanding of added-value
- Fear of job replacement is very real, but has not been seen on large-scale in reality



7. TECHNOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENTS ARE INCREASING ACCESS TO VOLUNTEERING

- New forms of technology (especially smartphones) allow people to engage in new ways
- Does not replace other forms of volunteering but expands the 'offer'
- Helps address the number one reason for not volunteering – lack of time (also physical access)
- Can help maintain involvement if people face other barriers throughout their life
- But not suitable for all types of volunteering
